



Whose Park Is It?

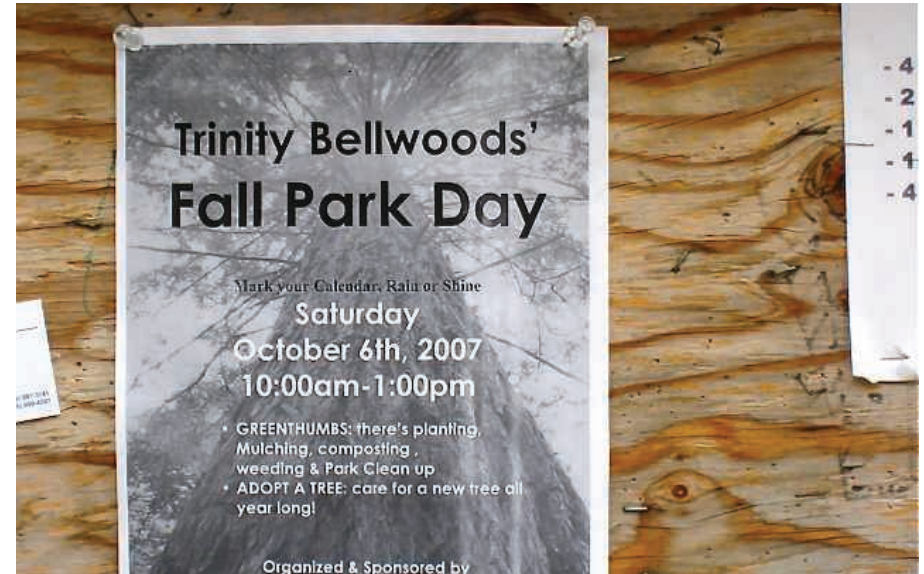
We have a website, three community meetings per year, and a Steering Committee

We work with our community

Capital Investment

125 playground users voted on a new piece of playground equipment for children ages 6-12.



Three years ago, the councillor approached the community and asked us if we wanted a greenhouse.



In response to the West End Community Bikeway Proposal, we created a “Don’t Pave Our Park” Petition.





Maintenance

Our Adopt-A-Tree program allows community members to care for new trees for the first three years of the tree's life.



Spring and Fall Park Days and Cleanup Days are another way that the community tries to help with park maintenance.



We conducted a survey of the park's 800+ trees with the University of Toronto Forestry Department and Neighbourhoods
