

Two new temporary garbage drop-off sites are opened--and two are closed

The city of Toronto opened two new temporary garbage drop-off sites yesterday, as the indoor and outdoor municipal workers' strike entered its 12th day. The new sites are at Centennial Arena Community Centre at 1967 Ellesmere Rd. and at Sunnybrook Park at 1132 Leslie St.

The city also announced that two existing garbage drop sites are reaching capacity and must be closed. The York Mills Arena site was closed last night and the Christie Pits site will close tomorrow at 7 p. m. Temporary garbage drop-off sites that remain open include: Ted Reeve Arena; Villiers Street between Saulter and Cherry streets; Sunnyside Park; Sir Casimir Gzowski Park; Eglinton Flats east of Jane Street; Eglinton Flats off Emmett Avenue; Etienne Brule Park; George Bell Arena at 215 Ryding Ave.; North Toronto Memorial Arena; Moss Park; Herbert H. Carnegie Centennial Arena at 580 Finch Ave. W.; Caledonia Park at 1135 Caledonia Rd.; Earlscourt Park; Taylor Creek Park; Scarborough Arena at 75 Birchmount Rd.; Wishing Well Park; and the Highland Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant at 51 Beechgrove Dr.
