Toronto's 2009 Capital Budget supports growth and liveability

Today Mayor David Miller and Budget Chair Shelley Carroll (Councillor, Ward 33 Don Valley East) introduced a Capital Budget and future plan that lays the foundation for a liveable city with opportunity for all.

"We've developed a capital budget that invests strategically in growth and renewal, and provides a sound financial plan," said Mayor David Miller.

For the first time, the City is introducing a 10-year capital budget forecast as part of the proposed budget. The City of Toronto's proposed 2009 Capital Budget is \$1.6 billion, with a recommended 2009-2013 Capital Plan of \$11 billion.

This 10-year capital plan and forecast determines the capital projects the City will undertake to maintain and/or improve City assets such as roads, bridges, transit, community centres, libraries and more. The proposed budget includes an investment in new fire stations, new ambulances, public transit, green buildings and green technologies.

"The proposed budget provides for investment in our facilities and infrastructure, renews our infrastructure and makes investments in reducing our backlog. It plans ahead for growth, and reduces our need for debt over time." said Budget Chair Carroll.

During the 2009 Capital Budget process, Torontonians can have their opinions considered in several ways:

1. Make a public presentation to the Budget Committee at its Capital Budget Hearing.
